Q How are the sacraments of initiation celebrated for the elect (those who will be baptized)?



A The elect celebrate initiation at the Easter Vigil, the night when the Church tells the story of salvation and celebrates Christ's triumph over sin and death. After the homily, the elect are presented to the assembly. The Litany of the Saints is sung, the water in the font is blessed, and the elect profess their faith and are baptized. They receive a white garment and lighted candle, symbols of their new life in Christ. Following Baptism, they are confirmed and sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, then they join in the Eucharistic Prayer. They receive the Body and Blood of Christ for the first time, now one at the table of the Lord with everyone else.

## March 28, 2021 | Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Is 50:4-7 | Phil 2:6-11 | Mk 14:1-15:47 or Mk 15:1-39

### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

From early childhood, I remember Palm Sunday – there was a kind of excitement about receiving the fresh palms, followed by the somber reading of the Passion. The contrast strikes me: While the palms, in ancient times, symbolized goodness and victory, hope and triumph, the account of Jesus' suffering and death reminds us of the price he paid for our redemption. Jesus knew that we can't have one without the other. It is the paradox of the cross: Jesus gave his life so that we might live. For many, the past year has been like one long Good Friday, filled with discouragement, suffering, and loss. As we reflect on Jesus' passion, the palms we carry home remain a sign of hope; we know now how the story will end. As we place our palms in a special place, let us say a prayer of thanks to Jesus and ask for the grace to renew our faith and trust in God as we enter Holy Week.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

There is a richness in the liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil that is both humbling and uplifting. This time period, known as the Sacred Triduum (Latin for "three days"), is the official end of Lent, and the summit of the liturgical year. As a society, we give far more attention to the buildup and celebration of Christmas – which is not to deny its importance, of course! – and so sometimes the Triduum is not as familiar to people in both its meaning and importance. Yet, it is during these days that we most intentionally remember and celebrate the gift of our redemption; we liturgically embrace the paschal mystery of Christ: dying he destroyed our death, and rising he restored our life. We have faced a difficult year together, and we rely on each other for prayer. As we continue through this Holy Week, perhaps we can accompany each other by attending the services with one another, or at least setting aside complementary prayer time on our own.

**PRAY** A local Eagle Scout built a beautiful outdoor Stations of the Cross at a college campus near us. Visit your parish or outdoor stations and reflect on each one. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has excellent resources for praying the stations: www.usccb.org.



As our regular programs start to return, Mrs. Ficca is no longer able to livestream all of the daily Masses. We are looking for at least one additional volunteer to be a part of our team. We especially need help on **Saturday mornings** and to serve as a backup. Training will be provided but a good understanding of the movements of the Mass is needed. Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During this time of the Pandemic, as we prepare to celebrate the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, I am inviting you to gaze at the Crucifix to see what would have happened to us if Jesus had not taken our sins upon himself in Baptism and nailed them on the cross.

I am writing to you on Tuesday, March 23, 2021. Today's readings (Numbers 21:4-9; John 8:21-30) teach us that our Lord was lifted up so that we may recognize him as our Lord and Savior, repent of our sins, so that we may have eternal life. In John 3:14, Jesus declares: "As Moses lifted up the bronze snake on a pole in the desert, in the same way the Son of Man must be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." This is God speaking. That is why in John 8:28 Jesus adds: "When you lift up the Son of Man, you will know that I AM. I AM in Exodus 3:14 is the name of God. So, God is the one being lifted up for our salvation, like Moses lifted up the bronze serpent so that everyone who obeyed God and looked at it would be healed of the poison by the power of God. – No wonder physicians use a bronze serpent on a pole as their symbol.

In Genesis 3:15 God declares to the devil: "I will make you and the woman (Blessed Virgin Mary) hate each other; ... her offspring (Jesus) will crush your head." God has the power to crush the devil. That is symbolized clearly in Exodus 7:8-12. In an effort to convince the King to let the Israelites leave Egypt, by the power of God, Aaron's walking stick turned into a snake. The King's magicians swung a type of Egyptian snakes in such a way that their blood concentrated in their heads so that they became stiff like walking sticks. When they put them down, their blood flowed back normally so that they wriggled again like snakes do. But Aaron's walking stick, by the power of God, swallowed up the magicians' snakes, symbolizing what Jesus would do to the devils on the cross.

My dear brothers and sisters, I am digging out all this to show you that God has the plan, power and desire to save all of us from our poisonous situations, habits, and any other dangers. We just have to raise our heads towards him and obey the only command of the Blessed Virgin Mary: "Do whatever he tells you." (Jn 2:5).

As long we keep doing what God tells us to do, we should not have any worries or anxieties. There were many poisonous snakes in the desert where the Israelites passed. As long as the Israelites did not grumble against God, the snakes did not poison them. If we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus we shall survive even the pandemic (at least spiritually) and any other danger, including death, so that we rise with Christ to eternal happiness.

Thank you all for your continued generosity towards Christ our King! May God bless you abundantly! May the Lord assist all the sick, the lonely, the stressed, the poor, the homeless, the bereaved, and the dead!


