### Holy Communion - Part 1

#### Role of Priest and Extraordinary Ministers

The reception of Holy Communion at Mass is “the source and summit of the Christian Life” (CCC 1324).

This is a three-part series that will focus on various aspect of Holy Communion. This week we will share the history and role of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Next week we will focus on how to receive this most precious sacrament, and the third part will discuss how to prepare for the sacrament and who can receive it.

Since the Council of Vatican II, our laity have been encouraged to assist in this sacrament where needed. They serve as Ministers to the Sick & Homebound and also as Extraordinary Ministers at Masses in the Modern Rite. These individuals have been called to this ministry for a variety of reasons and are vitally important in the sharing of our faith. The Vatican clearly recognized the need to include the laity as the number of priests decreased. It also more closely follows the practices of our early church as led by the Disciples and early church leaders. The church issued the document “Fidei Custos” in 1969 which authorized the laity to help distribute communion. Since that time, various other documents and letters have reasserted this right. On March 25, 2004, The Holy See issued “Instruction Redemptionis Sacramentum” which clearly outlines the role of Extraordinary Ministers within our Faith. These documents can be found on the Vatican website.

It is important to remember that our liturgy is not restricted to priest and other ordained ministers. We, the congregation, are required and necessary to fulfill the requirements of Mass. It is our responsibility as the laity to be active participants in all aspects of the liturgy. This includes serving as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, lectors, altar servers, ushers, and musicians to name a few (CCC 1548). Each parish has guidelines for training in these various roles, and the pastor oversees the installation of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.

And a little food for thought: If we are not worthy enough to serve as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion; then, we are not worthy to receive Holy Communion either.

**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

Everything in God's creation is intended to reflect his goodness and proclaim his glory. It's not hard to understand this idea when we behold the majesty of the sea. It can be more difficult, however, to remember this is also present in each of us and in our relationships – including that relationship God designed for man and woman: marriage. Our ability to turn away from God means that we sometimes reject, rather than reflect, him. This is one reason why Jesus responds to the Pharisees' question by revoking Moses' allowance for divorce, a concession God had made to the Israelites in the Old Testament. Jesus' statement might be unsettling because, in our time, divorce has affected nearly *everyone* in one way or another. But his words indicate the strength of the covenant the Lord has made with us: his love is permanent and unbreakable. We learn that the unbreakable bond between spouses reflects, in an imperfect way, God's perfectly faithful love for us.

**PRACTICE** We can reflect God's faithful love by becoming faithful ourselves. Choose one or two ways to exercise fidelity in little things this week. Examples might be getting up at the same time every morning without hitting the "snooze" button; spending five extra minutes in prayer each day; or offering a prayer of thanksgiving to God every time you are tempted to check your phone unnecessarily.

**GO EVANGELIZE**

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

We find this truth about love in the wisdom of the Church. Love is not a "feeling." It is an action – a virtue – in which we consistently *will the good of another*. After all, this is who and what God is: a continuous outpouring of love. Our triune God is a relational community of love, and Jesus offers us the preeminent example of this: As the Son and out of love for the Father, he *chose* to remain on the cross, regardless of how he *felt*. Such was his love for us that he willed our redemption and sent us the Spirit to help us remain with him. Marriage, designed by God to mirror this triune communal, covenantal love, likewise requires a *decision to love* that is firm and constant, despite how we might *feel*. If we wish to be capable of the fidelity required for marriage, family life, or simply for our relationship with God, we must make the deliberate choice to love – *and we must do it over and over*. With time and with God's grace, the habit of choosing another's good becomes easier, and we experience the joy of a stable and authentic love.


