PARISH REGISTRATION

Registering in the parish is the primary way we have of communicating with you, and is required for Sacramental purposes and for your children's participation in Christian Formation Programs. BAPTISM

Baptism of children under the age of 8 takes place at regular weekend Masses throughout the year except during Lent. Please contact our Faith Formation Office at least three months prior to the desired date. All parents must attend a three-hour class.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

For Confirmation preparation of teenagers, please contact our Youth Minister. For Baptism of older children and adults, all First Communion preparation and Confirmation of adults, please contact our director of Faith Formation. Adults who are considering becoming Catholic are invited to participate in our RCIA program.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Please call the office at least six months in advance to set dates, make arrangements for instruction and for planning the ceremony. Marriage Preparation for the couple is a requirement.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Scheduled on Saturdays, 3:30-5:00 p.m. in the church or by appointment

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

This sacrament is administered on request to those who are ill at home, undergoing surgery, are in the hospital, or in a nursing home.

Holy Communion: Part 3

Role of Priest and Extraordinary Ministers

The reception of Holy Communion at Mass is "the source and summit of the Christian Life" (CCC 1324).

This is part 3 of a three-part series on Holy Communion. This week we will discuss how to prepare for the sacrament and who can receive it.

The most basic requirement to participate in Holy Communion is to be a baptized Catholic "in good standing" who has received the Sacrament of First Holy Communion. Most commonly, in the United States, we make our First Holy Communion at the age of 7 or in the second grade. Prior to making our First Communion, regardless of our age, we participate in sacramental preparation classes to educate us on the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion.

What does "in good standing" mean? It means that one should be in a state of "grace" to receive the sacrament. "Anyone conscious of a grave sin must receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before coming to Communion" (CCC 1457). This does not mean we should not attend Mass. While the reception of Holy Communion is one of the most important parts of the Liturgy, it is not the only reasons we attend. Church doctrine requires that we attend Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation whether we are able to receive the Sacrament or not.

To prepare to receive Communion at Mass, "the faithful should observe the fast required in their church, typically one hour. Bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity, and joy of this moment when Christ becomes our guest" (CCC1387). The requirement of fast is to eat or drink nothing at least one hour before receiving Communion. Water and medications are permitted.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Our world lays down rules for greatness: wealth, accomplishment in the performing arts, beauty, business acumen. Hmmm. I don't recall hearing any of these attributes in the Scripture passages today. What I do remember is Jesus saying that whatever authority the disciples exercise must be rendered as service rather than for personal gain: "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant." Jesus, as we heard in the second reading, can "sympathize with our weaknesses" and understands that, as humans, we may be tempted to seek power and authority. And yet Jesus calls us to service. Does our service have to be something spectacular that the world would deem "great"? I believe that God's grace allows us to embrace the role of Christian servant in whatever way is most fitting for us, and that makes it great in God's eyes.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

On earth, we are told again and again the most powerful people are the toughest. Strength is measured by prestige and how many people serve you. Weakness will get you crushed. Jesus turns this message inside out and reminds us we must find strength in our weakness and use that strength to serve other people. Of course, being a servant to others may involve self-sacrifice and foregoing worldly cares and aspirations. But the more we take care of others, the happier we will be. Let us ask God to lift us up when we feel weak. As we heard in the second reading: "Confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help." Continuing the work of Jesus here on earth can transform our corner of the world.

WITNESS This week, ask the Holy Spirit to guide your family to help people in need. Prepare food for a soup kitchen, do yard work tasks for an elderly or ill neighbor, sign up to take the Eucharist to homebound parishioners in your parish, or offer tutoring services through a local school or library. Bring the gift of Jesus to others through your family's service. God wants us to use the gifts he gave us to care for others and create his kingdom here on earth.
